
• Children have a good understanding of the Liturgical Calendar, including which Church week and which Church year we are in currently.

- Collective Worship is always be referred to as Prayer and Liturgy in Religious Education.
- Pupils <u>participate</u> in Prayer and Liturgy <u>every day</u>. This could be in the form of whole school assembly, phase assembly, in-class prayer and liturgy, Mass, hymn practice or another form of liturgical gathering. Where there is no formal assembly or religious gathering, Prayer and Liturgy takes place in the classroom.
- Prayer and Liturgy is planned and independently led by pupils regularly. They then have the opportunity to reflect upon and evaluate their impact of worship.
- Prayer and Liturgy is inclusive and respectful of all faiths.
- Prayer and Liturgy is <u>not</u> a part of the R.E. timetable and is given additional time to plan and lead.
- Staff and pupils follow the structure in the proformas and completed copies are kept as evidence.
- Pupil-led proformas are stuck in the pupils' R.E. books.
- Children are aware of the theme of each Prayer and Liturgy.
- Children have a good understanding of 'The Word' / meaning of the scripture, as opposed to the words.
- Children begin to independently find and use scripture within their planning as they move up the school and develop their skills.
