SATS?!

- First, our children are more than the scores on paper and each child develops at different paces through life.
- Stress, anxiety, emotional de-regulation are not needed for the SATS.
- Access Arrangements – children who require, more time, different size paper, breaks, a different room to achieve their best we will offer the best support we can.

Scaled Scores

- What is meant by 'scaled scores'?
- 100 will always represent the 'national standard'.
- Each pupil's raw test score will therefore be converted into a score on the scale, either at, above or below 100.
- The scale will have a lower end point somewhere below 100 and an upper end point above 100.
- A child who achieves the 'national standard' (a score of 100) will be judged to have demonstrated sufficient knowledge in the areas assessed by the tests.
- In July 2016 for the first publication of test results, each pupil received:
 - A raw score (number of raw marks awarded).
 - A scaled score in each tested subject.
 - Confirmation of whether or not they attained the national standard. (AS)

Scaled Score Examples

On publication of the test results in July 2016:

- A child awarded a scaled score of 100 was judged to have met the 'national standard' in the area judged by the test.
- A child awarded a scaled score of more than 110 was judged to have exceeded the national standard and demonstrated a higher than expected knowledge of the curriculum for their age.
- A child awarded a scaled score of less than 100 was judged to have not yet met the national standard and performed below expectation for their age.

The Tests

- Key Stage 2 SATs take place nationally in the week commencing 11th May - 14th May 2026
- Statutory tests will be administered in the following subjects:
 - Punctuation , Vocabulary and Grammar (45 mins) and Spelling (20mins)
 - Reading (60 mins)
 - Mathematics
 - Paper 1: Arithmetic (30 minutes)
 - Paper 2: Reasoning (40 minutes)
 - - Paper 3: Reasoning (40 minutes)
- All tests are externally marked.
- Writing will be 'Teacher Assessed' internally, as in recent years.

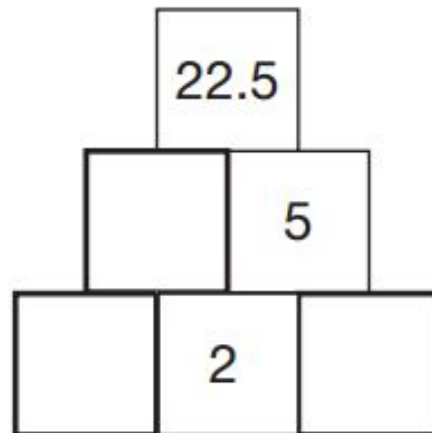
Maths Paper 2 / Paper 3 : Reasoning

How to Help Your Child

- First and foremost, support and reassure your child that there is nothing to worry about and they should always just try their best. Praise and encourage!
- Ensure your child has the best possible attendance at school.
- Support your child with any homework tasks.
- Reading, spelling and arithmetic (e.g. times tables) are always good to practise.
- Talk to your child about what they have learnt at school and what book(s) they are reading (the character, the plot, their opinion).
- Make sure your child has a good sleep and healthy breakfast every morning!

Writing Assessment.

- Children's writing is assessed within school and then moderated by Bury.
- Children are assessed using TA Framework (I can statements)
- A child will receive Working Towards, Expected or Greater Depth – just like the exam papers.
- A child must meet all the standards at one level to be able to reach the next.

- Work assessed also has to be independent – children are supported through the process but to be used as evidence it has to be with little teacher aid.
